Guide to Ballot Measures

STATEWIDE

Amendment V ● **YES/FOR** Lowering Age for State Legislature
A yes vote supports the reduction of the age of qualification from 25 to 21 for members of the State House of Representatives or the State Senate.

Amendment W ● **YES/FOR** Ballot Language for Judicial Elections
A yes vote supports the shortening of ballot language on judicial retention elections by eliminating repetitive language.

Amendment X ● **YES/FOR** Definition of Industrial Hemp
A yes vote gives the state legislature more flexibility to protect local hemp interests and regulate industrial hemp.

Amendment Y ● **YES/FOR** Congressional Redistricting
A yes vote supports the creation of an independent 12-member commission responsible for approving district maps for Colorado's Congressional Districts instead of the state legislature.

Amendment Z ● **YES/FOR** State Legislative Redistricting
A yes vote supports the creation of an independent 12-member commission responsible for approving district maps for Colorado's State House of Representatives and State Senate districts; establishes qualifying criteria for members.

Amendment A ● **YES/FOR** Remove Slavery Language
A yes vote repeals language in the Colorado Constitution about an exemption to the ban of slavery that allowed for slavery and involuntary servitude as punishment for a crime.

Amendment 73 ● **YES/FOR** Pre-K through HS Education Funding
A yes vote would provide an additional \$1.6 billion in funding for Colorado schools by replacing the state's current single rate individual income tax with a progressive tax.

Amendment 74 ☒ **NO/AGAINST** Punishing Health & Safety Regulators
A no vote will protect local government from paying corporations or special interests if they sue over regulations, zoning or public health standards that affect their property.

Amendment 75 ● **YES/FOR** Campaign Contribution Limits
A yes vote allows contribution limits for candidates in a race be increased to five times the current limit in the state constitution if another candidate contributes more than \$1 million to their own campaign.

Proposition 109 ☒ **NO/AGAINST** Bankrupt the State for Transportation
A no vote opposes the authorization of \$3.5 billion in bonds that would force substantial cuts in education and healthcare to balance the budget.

Proposition 110 ● **YES/FOR** Responsible Funding for Roads
A yes vote supports the authorization of bonds for transportation projects and raises the state sales and use taxes to repay the debt.

Proposition 111 ● **YES/FOR** Payday Loan Reform
A yes vote restricts charges on payday loans to yearly rate of 36% and would eliminate all other finance charges and fees associated with payday lending.

Proposition 112 ● **YES/FOR** Setbacks for Oil & Gas Development
A yes vote mandates that new oil and gas development projects, including fracking, be a minimum distance of 2,500 ft. from areas such as homes, schools, hospitals and water sources.

Question 1A ● **YES/FOR** Open Space Mill Levy Extension
A yes vote extends current open space funding until 2034.

COLORADO MOUNTAIN COLLEGE

Ballot Issue 7D ● **YES/FOR** Mill Levy Adjustment
A yes voter allows CMC's elected trustees to adjust the college's mill levy to maintain affordable tuition levels.
